In order to disseminate information to the public accurately and without distortion so to avoid misunderstanding and hamper the efforts of officials concerned in maintaining peace and order, relevant persons and organizations shall act as follows:

1. Prohibit the owners of printed media and of television and radio programmes, editors, programme hosts, and media, from inviting individuals or groups not currently holding official positions, both from the government and academic sectors, as well as former judges, those who worked in the judicial system and independent organizations, to give interviews or to express their opinions which might lead to further violent conflict and create confusion to the society. Those who violate this order shall be charged and prosecuted, and those print and broadcast media banned immediately.

2. The NPOMC asks the Provincial Governors, the Ministry of Interior's officials, as well as the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Bureau and Commander of the Provincial Police, to suppress any gathering and action aimed at opposing the operations of the NPOMC at the earliest opportunity. Should they find the situation beyond their capacity to handle, they are to report to the nearest military command unit.

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In order to ensure that the dissemination of information and news to the public is accurate and without distortion which might cause misunderstanding and negative impact on the maintenance of peace and order, the NPOMC therefore requires that all mass media entrepreneurs and service providers, both of broadcasting radio stations, public or private, analog television channels, satellite television channels, cable television channels, internet television channels, newspapers, journals, or any printed media, and all electronic media service providers, including communications through online social networks, refrain from transmitting the following information and news:

1. False or defamatory messages or messages causing hatred toward the Monarchy, the Heir-Apparent, and all members of the Royal Family.
2. News which might be threatening to the national security and defamatory to other persons.
3. Criticism of the operations of the NPOMC or its officials and other relevant personnel.
4. Audio or visual information or video recording or confidential information on the operations of government agencies.
5. Information and news which might cause confusion or provoke further conflict or divisions within the Kingdom.
6. Persuasion to gather or assemble in order to oppose officials of the NPOMC and its relevant personnel.
7. Threats to attack or injure any person that might cause public panic or fear.

The above-mentioned media have the duty to disseminate information and news as informed by the NPOMC.

With a view to ensuring effective administration by the NPOMC, structure, duties and responsibilities of the NPOMC are hereby laid out as follows:

**1. Structure:** the NPOMC is to be divided into three levels

**1.1 Policy level:** consists of

1.1.1 National Peace and Order Maintaining Council lead by Head of NPOMC, four Deputy Head of the NPOMC and one Secretary-General;

1.1.2 Advisory body on security issues

**1.2 Implementation level:** consists of

1.2.1 Security Division

1.2.2 Economic Division

1.2.3 Social psychology Division

1.2.4 Law and the justice system Division

1.2.5 Special mission Division

1.2.6 Special Division under direct command of the NPOMC

**1.3 Operational level:** consists of government agencies under direct command of the NPOMC which include

1.3.1 Ministries, Government Bureaus, Departments and other government agencies under direct command of the Head of the NPOMC

1.3.2 Peace and security maintaining command

**2. Functions:** entities in each level shall have the following functions

**2.1 Policy level**

2.1.1 The NPOMC is to determine the country's administrative policy, both short term and long term, to be followed by the implementation and operational level

2.1.2 Advisory body on security issues is to give advice to the NPOMC as requested or per their own initiatives.

**2.2 Implementation Level**

Entities under the implementation level have a function to administer, control and supervise the work of ministries, government bureaus, departments, and other relevant

government agencies in their respective area of responsibility in order to ensure that the policy laid down by the NPOMC is adhered to.

### 2.3 Operational Level

Entities under the operational level have a function to carry out the policy as laid down by the NPOMC

## **3. Responsibility and Administrative Arrangements**

3.1 Office of the Secretary-General of the NPOMC: General Udomdetch Sritaboot, Secretary-General of the NPOMC is to be the Director of the Office, and has the responsibility to oversee government agencies that are under direct command of the Head of the NPOMC, and all other government agencies not specified herein. In addition, the Secretary General has a responsibility to oversee the administration of the NPOMC, together with Lieutenant General Chatudom Thitasiri, Deputy Chief- of-Staff of the Royal Thai Army, as Deputy Secretary of the NPOMC

3.2 Peace and Order Maintaining Command (POMC): consists of the Commanding General of the 1<sup>st</sup> Army Area as Commander of the POMC. Divisions under command shall consist of Peace and Order Maintaining Command of 1<sup>st</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> Army Regional Commands (Thai Armed Force and Royal Thai Police to take lead on strategic matters)

3.3 Security Division: General Thanasak Patimaprakorn, Deputy-Head of the NPOMC, is to be the Director of the division; whereas General Aksara Geotpol, Chief-of-staff of the Royal Thai Army is to be Deputy Director of the division. Government agencies under control shall consist of the following four agencies:

- Ministry of Defence
- Ministry of Interior
- Ministry of Information and Communication Technology
- Ministry of Foreign Affairs

3.4 Social Psychology Division: Admiral Narong Pipattanasai, Deputy-Head of the NPOMC is to be the Director of the division; whereas Lieutenant General Surachet Chaiwong, Deputy Chief-of-Staff of the Royal Thai Army, is to be Deputy Director of the division. Government agencies under control shall include:

- Ministry of Natural Resource and Environment
- Ministry of Education
- Ministry of Health
- Ministry of Science and Technology
- Ministry of Culture

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In order for the dissemination of news and information to return to normalcy and to ensure that they are circulated accurately and without distortion such that it leads to misunderstanding and adversely affect the maintenance of peace and order, the NPOMC hereby announce that:

1. The following terrestrial analog television stations, which have broadcasting licenses, may continue to broadcast their normal programming:

- (1) Royal Thai Army Television Channel 5
- (2) The National Broadcasting Services of Thailand (NBT Channel)
- (3) Modern Nine TV (Channel 9)
- (4) Thai Public Broadcasting Services (Thai PBS)

2. 4. The above mentioned TV channels and radio broadcasting services are to broadcast information on announcements and orders of the National Peace and Order Maintaining Council immediately upon release.

2. Any matter that requires consent from Parliament, the House of Representatives or the Senate as stipulated by law shall now come under the power and responsibility of the Head of the NCPO in giving such consent instead of Parliament, the House of Representatives or the Senate.

This announcement shall take effect immediately
